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CEDC TO CO-HOST THE 8TH ANNUAL VENTURA COUNTY HOUSING CONFERENCE

Ventura, California—The Cabrillo Economic Development Corporation (CEDC) is once again proud to be a co-host of the annual Ventura County housing conference along with Housing Opportunities Made Easier (HOME) and Ventura County Economic Development Association (VCEDA). The 8th Annual Ventura County Housing Conference will take place Wednesday, September 30, 2009, from 7:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., at the Ventura County Office of Education Conference Center, 5100 Adolfo Road in Camarillo. CEDC is a founding sponsor of the conference and has been committed to growing the awareness for the need of housing that's affordable in Ventura County for 28 years.

Attendees are expected to include advocates of housing that's affordable, business leaders, local officials, developers, architects, realtors, service providers and consumers. Attendees will be able to attend educational sessions and get industry updates on regional housing issues. This year's forum, themed: "Lead, Follow, or Get Out of the Way," will focus on leadership, best practices, policy issues, and accountability at all levels.

Nationally known author and motivational speaker Terry Paulson has been booked as the keynote to inspire conference attendees into action, and teach them valuable leadership skills. The opening session brings together three bright minds in the industry to discuss affordable housing opportunities and solutions: Economist Bill Watkins of the California Lutheran University School of Business, Deputy Director Chris Westlake of the California Department of Housing and Community Development, and Dawn Dyer, President of Dyer Sheehan Group of Ventura. The conference continues with breakout sessions, a workshop especially for elected officials, a table top trade show, and concludes with a Town Hall Forum.
